

- Mini-branch with collection & services


The Services Include:


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
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Circulation Data: August 22 – October 5

- 110 Checkouts from FCL Collection @ IU Southeast
 - Compared: 308 Checkouts for IU Southeast (September 2022)
- 57 Holds placed and transferred to IU Southeast
- 218 items returned from IU Southeast to FCL

Patron Registration Data: August 24 – October 5th

- 43 IU Southeast FCL Registrations
 - 12 Non-Resident IU Southeast Students
 - 8 Non-Resident IU Southeast Faculty & Staff
 - 14 Floyd County Resident/IU Southeast
 - 9 Reciprocal Borrower
- 12 IU Southeast Community Borrowers
 - Compared: **19** for 2021–2022





The institution's mission is clear and articulated publicly; it guides the institution's operations.

- **1.B.** The institution's mission demonstrates commitment to the public good.
 - 1. The institution's actions and decisions demonstrate that its educational role is to serve the public, not solely the institution or any superordinate entity.
 - 2. The institution's educational responsibilities take primacy over other purposes, such as generating financial returns for investors, contributing to a related or parent organization, or supporting external interests.
 - 3. The institution engages with its external constituencies and responds to their needs as its mission and capacity allow.
